

Direction

Then the disciples came to him and asked, "Do you know that the Pharisees were offended when they heard this?

He replied, "Every plant that my heavenly father has not planted will be pulled up by the roots. Leave them; they are blind guides. If a blind man leads a blind man, both will fall into a pit."

Matthew 15:12-14

Cliches are plentiful on the subject of direction and goal planning. "If you aim at nothing, you'll hit it every time." "Failing to plan is planning to fail." Funny thing about cliches, though, is that they are usually true. Jesus had his own way of saying it. "Can a blind man lead a blind man? Will they not both fall into a pit? A student is not above his teacher, but everyone who is fully trained will be like his teacher." (Luke 6:39) In the parallel passage to this (see title verse, Matthew 15:12-14) we see Jesus upset with an upset group of men. The leaders of that day had lost their direction; they had lost their purpose for existing and had simply created a religious shop to keep.

A demonic danger to churches bent on restoring pure Christianity is the trap of meandering. Even among our fellowships of dynamic, growing ministries we can tend to be reactionary at times. We may oppose regimentation, but often replace it with less organized, less effective, and less directed programs. The scriptures leave much flexibility for autonomous approaches to ministries, but the great commission is not ambiguous. We are to teach, baptize, and teach to obey. The difference in effective congregations and super-effective congregations is often how they carry out the last part of the great commission--teach disciples **how to obey** the teachings of Jesus. In a word--direction. In the last five years, I have been blessed to be the evangelist in two dynamic, growing churches. In beginning the work here in New York, we merely implemented the Biblical principles we had practiced in Boston. And in my ever so few travels, one of the most frequent compliments our congregation receives is also one of the few weaknesses I've witnessed in other ministries--the training of your Christians to do the work of theministry. One of the keys to this strength is the unity of direction. We do have a planned method of both teaching the scriptures and teaching young Christians how to teach the scriptures. Because of its level of effectiveness and its absolute adherency to scripture, I'm inclined not to use the word "method" to our approach of discipling. But it is a method, in as much as there is a step by step conceptual theme to the studies. As autonomous congregations, we may elect not to use each other's "methods," but we should never react against being congregations with a set, Biblical direction.

Whether we wander around in a wilderness of lost souls or conquer the world for Christ depends on leaders in churches following God's plans of action and lending direction to a unified congregation. We can avoid the ditch of meandering, but not without paying the price of a good, solid Biblical approach to discipling, which every member of our congregations are a part of. Steve
